Option 1:

** What to Include in your bag or box:

 - * Why you chose it
 - * How it connects to your personal story

What to Do:

- 3. What age were you the first time you tried something new?(hobbies,sports, cheerleading, speaking in front of people,dance,modeling) And what was that new thing?
- 4. What age were you when you met your BFF?(Include a photo of you and your BFF) How did you meet?
- 5. Where were you born/raised?
- 6. What do you love most about living in Baltimore?
- 7. What was your favorite birthday memory
- 8. What are your future goals(college, career)
