# 📚 Summer Reading Assignment for 8th Graders 📚

This project will prepare them by allowing them to demonstrate their understanding of texts and its themes, develop their writing skills, and practice critical thinking.

## **▼** Step 1: Choose ONE book from the list below

- With the Fire on High by Elizabeth Acevedo (Fiction)
- **Before We Were Free** by Julia Alvarez (Historical Fiction)
- **Brown Girl Dreaming** by Jacqueline Woodson (Poetry/Novel)
- Look Both Ways: A Tale Told in Ten Blocks by Jason Reynolds (Fiction)
- The Giver by Lois Lowry (Dystopian/Science Fiction Novel)
- **The City of Ember** by Jeanne DuPrau (Post-Apocalyptic/Dystopian/Science Fiction)

# ✓ Step 2: Choose ONE project format

### Option 1: Diary

- This report will consist of **5 diary entries** and a cover for the diary.
  - Each diary entry should be at least 10 sentences.
  - Each diary entry should be from the perspective of the main character.

- The entries should cover events from the beginning to the end of the book.
- Think about the major events of the book, the mood of the characters, and how they might feel about other people in the book.

#### Option 2: Poster/Visual Representation

- This report will consist of a **poster** and **2 paragraphs**.
  - Your poster should include visual representations of characters, events, and other key elements from the book.
- Your 2 paragraphs should explain what each item represents from your poster and why you chose to include them.

#### Option 3: Book Review

• This report will consist of 3 paragraphs.

**Paragraph 1:** This should be a summary of the book. The summary should cover the ENTIRE book from beginning to end. Think about the most important characters and events.

**Paragraph 2:** You should talk about what you like about the book and why you would recommend it to others.

**Paragraph 3:** You should discuss what you disliked about the book and questions that you would like to ask the author.

# Paragraph Checklist

Each paragraph must be **at least 7 sentences** long. Please don't stop at 7 sentences if it doesn't completely answer the prompt. Use this checklist to polish your work:

- Spelling: Use a dictionary, family member, or spell-check tool.
- **Capitalization:** Check first words in sentences, names, places, and book titles.
- Punctuation: Use periods, commas, exclamation marks, and question marks correctly.

**Goal:** Show your understanding, creativity, and thoughtful reflection!
