Choose one of the following ways to do your book report
 □ Diary □ This report will consist of 5 diary entries and a cover for the diary. □ Each diary entry should be at least 10 sentences.

 Each diary entry should be from the perspective of the main character.
☐ The entries should cover events from the beginning to the end of
the book.
Think about the major events of the book, the mood of the
characters, and how they might feel about other people in the book.
☐ Poster/Visual Representation
☐ This report will consist of a poster and 5 paragraphs.
 Your poster should have visual representations of characters,
events, and other important information from the book.
Your 5 paragraphs should explain what each item represents from your poster and why you chose to include them.
☐ Book Review
☐ This report will consist of 5 paragraphs.
Your first paragraph should be a summary of the book. The
summary should cover the ENTIRE book from beginning to end.
Think about the most important characters and events.
Your second paragraph should talk about what you like about the
book and why you would recommend it to others.
Your third paragraph should discuss what you disliked about the book and questions that you would like to ask the author.
☐ Your fourth paragraph should discuss what lessons can be learned
from reading the novel.
Your fifth paragraph should discuss how the main characters has changed over the course of the text.
Paragraph Requirements
☐ Each paragraph should consist of 5 sentences.
☐ Please don't stop at 5 sentences if it doesn't completely answer the
prompt.
\square Skip a line - your responses should be hand written, clearly on lined paper, with
every other line skipped.
☐ Please use the following checklist to check your writing:
 Spelling: Use the internet, a guardian, or a dictionary to check your spelling.
Capitalization: Check the 1st letter of the sentence, names, places, and titles of books.
 Punctuation: Check that you used a period, exclamation point, and question mark when appropriate.
